Capacity and Capability – Developing a Regional Centre of Excellence for the East

What is a Regional Centre of Excellence?

A collaborative approach between DfT and STBs, which will enable STBs to provide tailored support for LTAs in their region.

What will STBs do?

- a. **Convening good practice and resources** – bringing LTAs together to share best practice and develop common approaches from one another.
- b. **Providing Tools and expertise** – developing tools for LTAs to use or providing guidance on particular areas or even leading work on behalf of LTAs.

Four Core Work Areas

Initially, all STBs' Regional Centres of Excellence will focus on maximising LTAs capability in these four core work areas:

1. Producing updated **Local Transport Plans**, which plan for the future and are in-line with the regional transport strategy
2. Providing support for **Quantifying Carbon Reductions**, a key requirement of LTPs.
3. Developing effective **business cases**.
4. Support each LTA in developing and maintaining a **pipeline of future schemes**.
